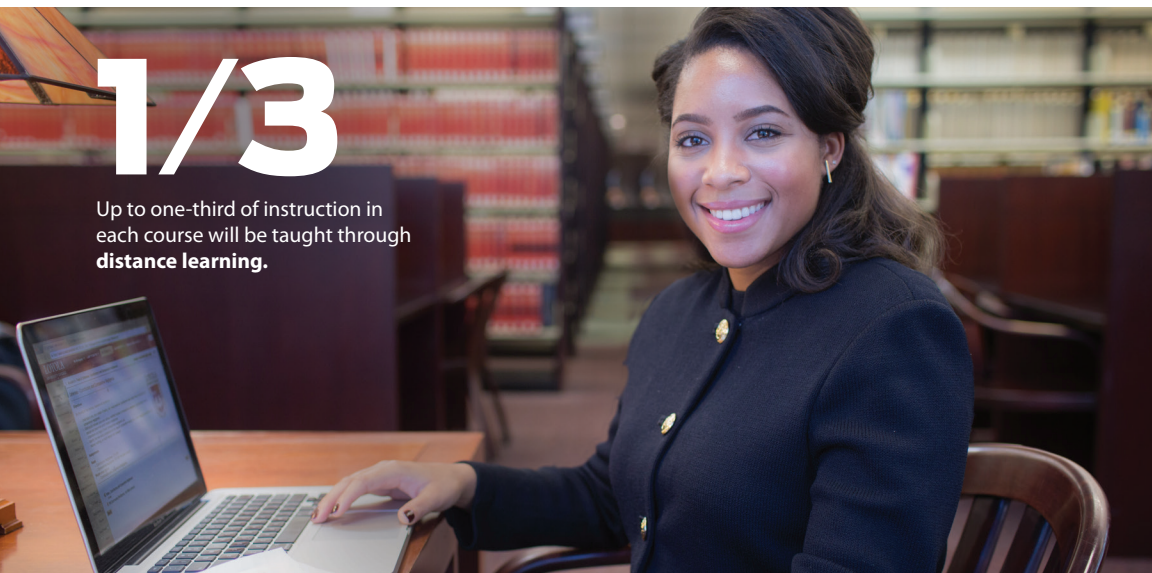

**Loyola's Weekend JD Program can be completed in four years by taking classes during academic semesters only, or you may shorten your degree completion by choosing to take courses during the summer terms following semesters two, four, six and/or take additional credit hours during semesters three through seven. A number of additional credit hours may also be earned by completing courses which are offered in a fully online format.*
