

The Center for Ministry Development Certificate in Youth Ministry Studies

2010-2011 Offerings

Since 1979, the *Certificate in Youth Ministry Studies* program has been training leaders across the United States for Catholic ministry with young and older adolescents.

Catholic Youth Ministry Training is designed to educate leaders in Catholic parishes and schools on the vision and practice of *Renewing the Vision--A Framework for Catholic Youth Ministry* (USCCB); correlated with the national competency standards for certification as developed by the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry in conjunction with the USCCB.

Integrated and Practical Ministry Education presents the knowledge, skills, practical tools and techniques needed for creative and comprehensive ministry with youth in parish and Catholic school settings; incorporates theology, developmental insights and practical ministry implementation; offers training and practical resources for providing adolescent catechesis within a comprehensive youth ministry framework.

Certificates are awarded by the sponsoring agency after the successful completion of all 8 courses.

Graduate Credit

Those seeking graduate credit must apply to the Institute of Pastoral Studies as a non-degree seeking student. (A bachelor's degree is a requirement for admittance). The project requirements and the readings for each course are much more extensive than for the certification only program. The tuition per course is \$2,010., + assorted fees. 3 graduate credits are given for successfully completing 2 weekends in one semester, (i.e., Fostering the Faith Growth of Youth Through Prayer and Worship and Justice and Service in the fall semester; Fostering the Faith Growth of Youth Through Pastoral Care and Evangelization and Catechesis in the spring semester.) Courses, dates and instructors, Fall 2010

Fostering the Faith Growth of Youth through Prayer and Worship investigates the foundational role that prayer and worship have in fostering the spiritual growth of youth. Participants develop understandings and practical skills necessary for: (a) promoting youth participation in liturgy, (b) fostering the prayer life of youth and preparing prayer services, and (c) understanding spiritual practices that support the development of spirituality in adolescents. Participants will apply these understandings by developing a realistic and integrated approach to worship within a comprehensive ministry to youth. *This course will be facilitated by Tom Tomaszek.*

Fostering the Faith Growth of Youth through Justice and Service explores the foundations for fostering a justice and service consciousness within a holistic spirituality in youth drawn from Scripture, Catholic Social Teaching, adolescent development, and contemporary catechetical principles. It develops skills for creating integrated, action-learning models for the justice and service component of a comprehensive youth ministry. *This course will be facilitated by Sean Lansing.*

Courses, dates and instructors, Spring 2011

Fostering the Faith Growth of Youth through Pastoral Care explores the principles and methods of caring for young people from various cultures and their families. The course develops an understanding of the breadth and depth of pastoral care, of family systems and adolescent development, and the role that cultural identity plays in the development of adolescents. The goal is two-fold: (a) it aims to promote healthy adolescent development from a pastoral care perspective and (b) to develop preventative interventions for families with adolescents. *This course will be facilitated by Lori Spanbauer.*

Fostering the Faith Growth of Youth through Evangelization and Catechesis develops the foundations and practices for nurturing faith growth and Catholic identity in younger and older adolescents through evangelization and catechesis. Participants will explore a variety of ways to promote a living relationship with Jesus in the lives of adolescents. They will examine a contemporary approach to developing Catholic identity and Catholic practices in the lives of adolescents today. Participants will experience and analyze the "postmodern" culture and develop strategies for faith formation with adolescents in a postmodern world. They will learn creative approaches for evangelization and catechesis and develop skills and methods for evangelizing and catechizing adolescents. *This course will be facilitated by Cheryl Tholcke.*
