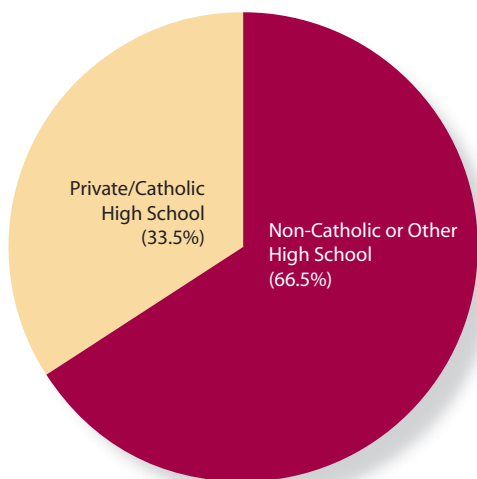


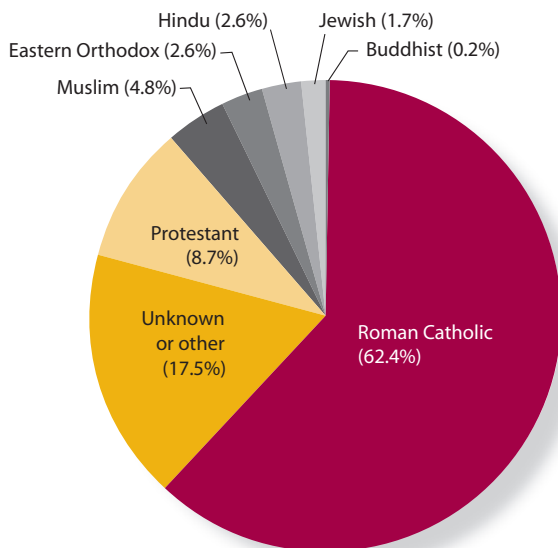

Type of high school attended



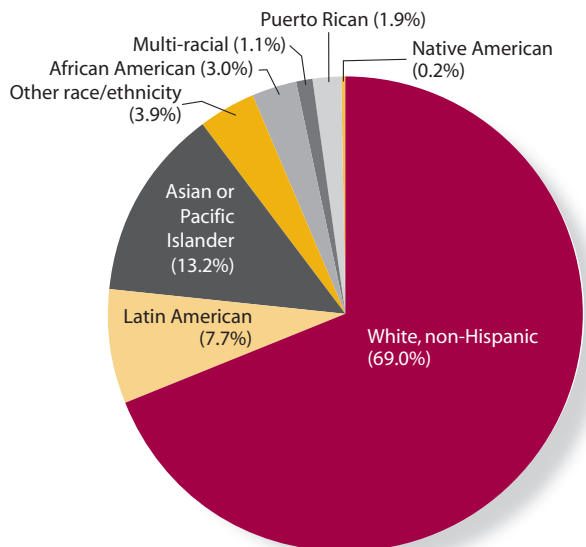
Religious affiliation

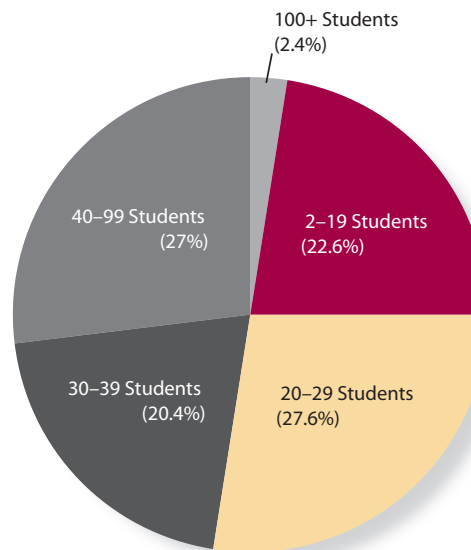


Race/ethnicity

Loyola University Chicago's low student-to-faculty ratio reflects its commitment to excellence in undergraduate education. For every 15 undergraduate students, there is one faculty member. 97% of faculty members hold the highest academic degrees in their respective fields.

Loyola's main residential campus is located on Chicago's North Side, minutes from downtown Chicago and the Water Tower Campus, and is set along the shore of Lake Michigan. It is home to the College of Arts and Sciences, Graduate School, and Marcella Niehoff School of Nursing. The School of Education also offers academic courses, programs, and student advising at the Lake Shore Campus. More than 4,000 students live in 19 residence halls. The Lake Shore Campus also includes the main Cudahy Library, Madonna della Strada Chapel, Joseph J. Gentile Center, Halas Sports Center, the Quinlan Life Sciences Education and Research Center, and Information Commons, a state-of-the-art study and instructional space.

WATER TOWER CAMPUS

Loyola's downtown campus is located along Pearson Street, just off North Michigan Avenue, Chicago's "Magnificent Mile." Here, undergraduates can complete one of many degree programs, as well as take advantage of internships at many of Chicago's business and cultural institutions. The Water Tower Campus is home to the Schools of Business Administration, Communication, Education, Law, and Social Work, and to selected programs in the College of Arts and Sciences. This campus also houses the Loyola University Museum of Art, as well as Baumhart Hall and Terry Student Center, where more than 600 upper-class and graduate students reside. Loyola's School of Communication opened its new location at the Water Tower Campus in early 2009.

FRESHMAN ADMISSION

Admission to Loyola is competitive and based on the student's academic transcript, class rank, standardized test scores, and recommendations.

TRANSFER ADMISSION

Transfer students must have graduated from high school or completed a GED, and have completed 20 credit hours of transferable college credit. Admission is based on college cumulative GPA. Without 20 transferable credit hours, high school transcripts and standardized test scores are required for admission.

- Enrollment and housing deposit deadline: **May 1****
- Priority deadline for Fall transfer admission: **June 1**
- Priority deadline for Spring transfer admission: **November 1**
