**Art History** BA

Through this major, you will develop a general background in the history of art and in your final year of study, you'll concentrate on an area of your choosing. The program prepares you for graduate school.

**Music** BA

**Visual Communication** BA

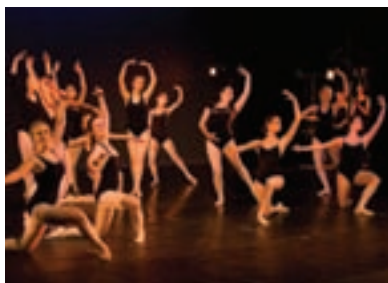
The visual communication program will develop your expertise in the elements of graphic design. A one-semester internship at a local advertising agency or design studio will complete your academic study.
