

How do we help students see themselves and learn about people different from themselves through literacy?









MIRROR: Texts that reflect one or more aspects of a student's identity or experience.



WINDOW: Texts that offer insight into someone else's experience or world.



SLIDING GLASS
DOOR: Readers
can walk into a
story and become

part of the world.

When has a text been like a window, offering you insight into someone else's experience or world??

What did you learn?

When has a text been like a sliding glass door, allowing you to enter and engage with another world for a moment in time?
