
ESSENTIAL QUESTION: Once we diversify our libraries, how can we encourage students to interact with texts in a way that cultivates empathy for people different from themselves?

What is empathy?

The ability to understand and share the feeling of others.



Discussing empathy as a concept can feel distant to children—and even to adults, at times. Yet we've found that empathy can be grounded in day–to–day life when we consider it in conjuction with getting to know eachother's stories. When we listen to others' stories with our whole selves—whether the stories are self–contained anecdotes or the unfolding of narratives of their lives and cultures—we are opening ourselves up to empathy. When we help our students stand in the shoes of those whose stories they hear, we are encouraging compassion.

The Interactive Read Aloud Model

Sacred time when teacher pulls students together to share a text

Teacher models thinking aloud a reading strategy and then students practice

Book Introduction

(Author, genre, summary, skill explanation)

Teacher Think Aloud #1

(Teacher models the strategy)

Student Practice # 1

(Student practices using turn-andtalk or stop-and-jot)

Teacher Think Aloud #2
Student Practice # 2

Discussion Questions

(Teacher facilitates discussion about book related to strategy)

15–20 minutes max

Read-alouds can be utilized during "awkward" schedule times such as before dismissal or after lunch.



Think Aloud Prompts to Encourage Empathy

- If you were in the character's shoes, what would you be thinking right now?
- If you were in the character's shoes, what would you be wishing for right now?
- If you were in the character's shoes, what would you be worried about right now?
- If you were in the character's shoes, what would you say or do right now?
