What is Loyola Law School 101?

It is a 2-day virtual program (via Zoom) that equips incoming students with tools to prepare for their first semester and the law school classroom. It's also an opportunity to better understand the School of Law and connect to its community of faculty, students, staff, and alumni.

When is Law School 101?

July 18-19, 2024. Zoom links will be sent to students prior to July 18.

Who can attend Law School 101?

This program is open to all incoming students.

How much does it cost?

There is no cost. Law School 101 is free for incoming students.

What's the difference between Law School 101 and Orientation for incoming students?

Law School 101 equips incoming students with legal skills to use in the law school classroom. There are legal skills sessions and a 1L Mock Class during Law School 101. Orientation provides critical information students need during their time at the School of Law, however not as much time on legal skills. We wanted to give students more time to learn legal skills, so we created Law School 101. Both Law School 101 and Orientation will provide an opportunity to learn more about the School of Law community.

Will Law School 101 sessions be recorded?

All sessions will be recorded and made available to students who cannot attend.

How do I register?

What will each day of the program cover?

Please see below. A more detailed schedule will be provided prior to the start of the program. Please note all programming will be virtual and in Central Time (CT).

• Day 1, July 18, 12-3pm CT

- An introduction to law school, commonly used vocabulary/legal jargon and the US court structure
- Reading and briefing cases + strategies for class preparation

Day 2, July 19, 12-4pm CT

- Professionalism, civil discourse, Loyola's mission and Professional Identity Formation (PIF) course
- 1L Mock Class and the Socratic method
- First semester expectations, growth mindset, school/life balance
