## **Education Law Practicum (Law 166, 1-4 credits)** Offered Fall Semester

The Education Law Practicum is designed to provide you with practical experience under the supervision of an attorney at a field placement site and a clinical professor from the School of Law. This practicum provides you with the opportunity to develop practice ready and problemsolving skills while working at an approved field placement outside of the classroom.

You can take the Education Law Practicum seminar (Law 166-001) as a stand-alone course without a field placement.
