Advanced Placement Assessment Traineeship

Traineeship can begin July 8, 2019 or late August (TBD) and ends on May 31, 2019.

Here are the following minimal duties for each doctoral level trainee in the assessment training position:

 - Assessment (testing clients, scoring protocols): 8-9 hours (testing typically occurs from 9am to 3pm Monday or Tuesday)
- Report writing
 - Complete individual report sections (e.g., administer a cognitive assessment battery and complete written analysis to be included in an integrated report). Share report authorship with psychological assessment supervisor.

2018-19 Academic Year (TBD-5/31/20)

- Minimum 12 hours per week.
 - Individual supervision: 1 hour weekly.
 - Assessment intake: 2 hours weekly (may vary by week).
 - Assessment (testing clients, scoring protocols): 8-9 hours (testing typically occurs from 9am to 3pm Monday or Tuesday)
- Report writing
 - Complete individual report sections (e.g., administer a cognitive assessment battery and complete written analysis to be included in an integrated report). Share report authorship with psychological assessment supervisor.
 - The opportunity to complete 1 or more full psychological assessments and reports during traineeship year.

Pre-requisites for trainees

- Coursework in intellectual assessment
- Coursework in personality/behavioral assessment
- Coursework in academic assessment (optional)
- Two letters of recommendation (one from an assessment instructor, if possible)

Loyola Community and Family Services is looking for an advanced doctoral level candidate for a psychological assessment only traineeship. This traineeship will be approximately 12 hours a week. This traineeship can begin in the summer (July 9, 2019) or in the Fall (TBD). The traineeship includes 1 hour of supervision with a dual licensed school psychologist / clinical psychologist.
