Therapy Traineeship

Traineeship begins the Wednesday before LUC academic school year begins and ends on May 31. You may have the ability to stay longer with permission from your direct supervisor and LCFS Director.

Doctoral Level Trainee

Here are the following duties each trainee is required to complete during traineeship year.

Minimum 20 hours per week

3-5 office-based clients 1 hour individual supervision

1 hour group supervision 1.5 hours didactic training

4-5 hours - paperwork & other duties (i.e., prep for groups, notes, etc.)

We assign trainees to a local school for school-based services (we do our best to assign to your preference of either a high school or elementary school). School-based duties include:

Three school-based individual cases

2 school groups run concurrently (goal is for trainees to conduct 2 groups each semester)

1 hour supervision for groups and school based services

Other Duties required by end of traineeship:

Learn and shadow intake procedures; conduct 4-6 intakes independently.

Present an in-service training with another trainee.

Participate and observe live therapy.

Conduct teacher consultation and school based behavioral intervention plan as client's needs require it.

Complete the following trainings during the year: DCFS Mandated Reporter Training, Loyola's Share the DREAM Undocumented Student Ally Training, Loyola's LGBTQ Safe Space Workshop, and PREPARE Training (school crisis intervention training).

Must commit to at least to 1 evening per week (3 to 7pm; M-Th) and Wednesday mornings (9 to 12) for didactic training and group supervision.

Clients at LCFS are diverse and are mostly from the Rogers Park and Edgewater communities. Rogers Park is one of the most diverse neighborhoods in Chicago where over 70 languages spoken. LCFS also has a large Spanish speaking population for those with the ability to conduct treatment in Spanish and looking to hone their bilingual clinical skills.
