Position Description

The *Healing Earth* (HE) Student Worker supports the HE team in administration, organization, research, outreach, communication, translations (if applicable), and miscellaneous tasks that are associated with the *Healing Earth* project. Under the supervision of the International Jesuit Ecology Project (IJEP) Program Manager, the student worker will work both collaboratively and independently while gaining professional skills in project coordination, management, and organization. No previous experience is needed.

Federal work-study students are encouraged to apply for this position.

Responsibilities

- Create infographics and design communication material
- Write newsletters and marketing campaigns
- Research and propose changes
- Post news and updates on Facebook page and bulletin board
- Moderate community forum; keep track of user additions and conduct surveys
- Gauge needs of users and gather useful information for future projects
- Organize topics of discussion to facilitate user interactions
- Navigate basic uses of WordPress
- Translations (if applicable)
- Outreach to audience
- Assist HE team as needed

The student worker must keep a consistent schedule in which they work the same days and hours each week for the internship. The schedule will be agreed upon by the student worker and the IJEP Program Manager before the start date. Schedule changes part-way through the internship will need to be approved by the IJEP Program Manager.
