Campus Sustainability Internships Fall 2024 – Spring 2025

Description

The Office of Sustainability is seeking qualified student interns to contribute to Loyola's campus sustainability programs. Sustainability reaches into many corners of the University and involves partnership building to set strategies and goals in creating a culture of sustainability through action. Interns will work in a team capacity (Student Sustainability Engagement team or Sustainable Materials Management team) with each other and staff to support data collection, conduct outreach, and have a leadership role with events and projects related to waste reduction, transportation, energy, and other campus sustainability initiatives.

Internship Positions

Climate Action Plan Outreach Lead

Duties and Responsibilities

- Support the Office of Sustainability in developing Loyola's next Climate Action Plan
- Present to varying groups at Loyola (students, staff or faculty) on Loyola's history of climate action and potential future actions
- Distribute and analyze surveys to the Loyola Community
- Convene groups to discuss climate action at Loyola and collect and synthesize feedback
- Lead your peers in creating sustainability change on campus

Student Sustainability Engagement Intern

Duties and Responsibilities

- Work with partners across the university to plan, promote, and implement events and programs to educate and
 engage students in sustainability throughout the academic year (including during WelcomeWeek,
 TransportationWeek, EnergyWeek, FoodWeek, WasteWeek, WaterWeek and EarthWeek)
- Manage engagement programs around sustainability for LUC students and alumni
- Develop and distribute the SustainLoyola newsletter and other marketing materials for sustainability programs, initiatives, and events
- Identify and implement additional opportunities to engage students to increase awareness of environmental issues, increase participation in existing sustainability programs, and support a culture of sustainability at Loyola
- Lead your peers in creating sustainability change on campus

Sustainable Materials Management Intern

Duties and Responsibilities

- Manage and grow Loyola's Zero Waste programs including Zero Waste Games, Compost Bucket Program, paper towel composting, Cycle & Recycle Center, and Think Green & Give
- · Support waste diversion and engagement at select university events
- Support and attend sustainability programs and events
- Lead your peers in creating sustainability change on campus

- Motivated individual willing to engage peers and stakeholders to take action
- Ability to work collaboratively and professionally in team settings and work individually in an efficient manner as needed.
- Some specific desired skills aligned with each intern team including communication skills (web, e-newsletter, social media, public speaking, engagement), design skills, event planning, and physical material sorting
- · Attention to detail

Eligibility

- Full-time enrollment at any Loyola University Chicago Campus in 2024-2025.
- Federal Work-Study eligible students are especially encouraged to apply.

Terms and Compensation

- Scheduling is flexible and hours will be 10-15 hours per week
- Compensation for this internship is \$16.20/hour
- Specific work schedule will be mutually agreed between interns and program manager
- · Interns are expected to participate in a standing weekly team meeting in addition to project team meetings as needed
