Biographical History

Orletta Ryan was born in Chicago and graduated from Mundelein College. Afterwards, she taught elementary school children in Chicago and eventually East Harlem. While in New York City, she wrote *The Schoolchildren: Growing Up in the Slums* with Mary Frances Greene, a fellow teacher. Subsequently, she wrote an article about city schoolchildren, which was published in the February 13, 1966 issue of *New York Times Magazine*. Both writings were highly commended. Orletta Ryan Carlton died in 2008.

Scope and Content

The Orletta Ryan papers are dated between 1963 and 1967, with a small amount of correspondence dated 2006. They are divided into four series: Personal/professional, Publications, Monographs, and Press Coverage.
